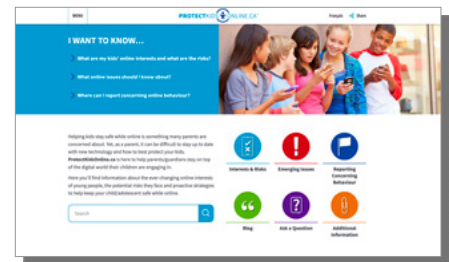

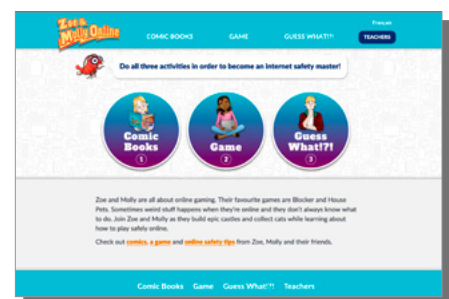


Zoe and Molly Online is an interactive series that gives kids in grade 3 and 4 an opportunity to have some fun while exploring what it means to be safe while playing games online. It is an engaging experience on its own but becomes all the more powerful when the comics and lesson plan is used as a springboard for conversations about how to stay safe while playing games online and the risks associated with sharing their personal information and sending pictures online.

Type of resource: comic books, online game, quiz for children in grades 3 and 4; lesson plan for educators or parents to use

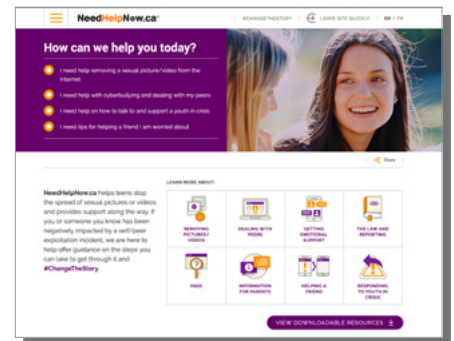


NeedHelpNow.ca is a website that helps teens stop the spread of sexual pictures or videos and provides support along the way. It includes a section to help parents manage this growing social challenge by providing guidance on ways to talk to your teen about this issue, possibly to prevent this from happening, along with providing information on what to do if your child is negatively impacted by peers sharing a sexual picture or video.

Kids in the Know Safety and Activity Sheets cover a variety of topics and can be used by parents/guardians with children in kindergarten to high school to have important safety conversations. Examples of sheets include: assertiveness skills, online safety, keep and speak secrets, babysitting tips, and healthy relationships.

Protecting Your Child is a resource intended to help parents/guardians better understand the issue of child sexual abuse. Topics covered include the scope of child sexual abuse, personal boundaries, adult supervision, children’s use of internet-enabled devices, concerning sexual behaviour in children, what to talk to your child about, and reporting.

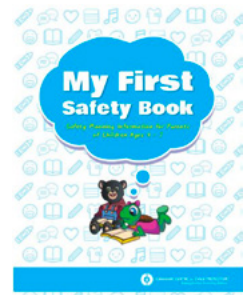

Topics in this resource include safe grown-ups, identifying and labelling feelings, naming body parts, healthy boundaries, and okay and not okay secrets.

Big Feelings Come and Go is a storybook teaches kids about freeze, flight, and fight and helps them learn some basic self-regulation skills. Understanding freeze, flight, and fight can allow for new conversations about how your child feels and what to do to help them manage their big feelings.

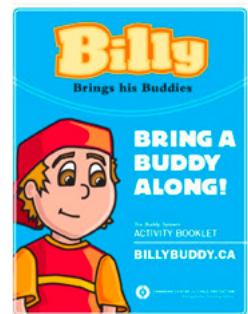


The Billy Brings his Buddies Activity Book designed for grade 1 students and helps teach children about the Buddy System.

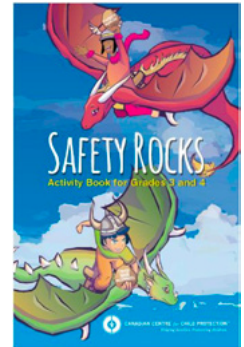

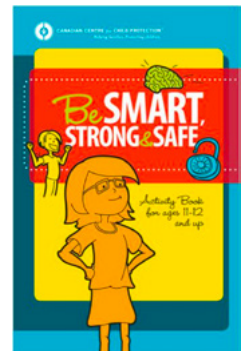


Be Smart Strong and Safe is an activity book that helps children in grades 5 and 6 to identify inappropriate behaviour, learn how to set boundaries, and how to talk to a safe adult when something makes them feel uncomfortable. Through various activities, children develop an understanding of healthy and unhealthy behaviours, and how to pay attention to different behaviours in order to stay safe.

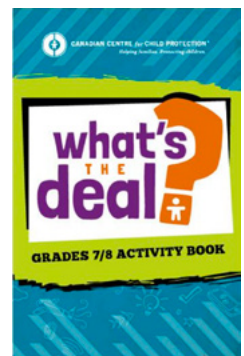


What's the Deal is an activity book that teaches youth in grades 7 and 8 about healthy relationships and boundaries. Through various engaging activities, youth will be able to identify the difference between healthy and unhealthy relationships, how to set personal boundaries, and how to get out of uncomfortable situations when those boundaries have been broken. Youth will learn how easy it is to lose control of information and photos shared online, and when to get help from a safe adult.

It is a Big Deal teaches teens the difference between healthy and unhealthy dating relationships, including the issue of sexual consent. Through various activities, teens will learn about love versus control in dating relationships. They will learn about self-peer exploitation (sexting), Canada's sexual consent laws, and how to get help if they find themselves in an uncomfortable situation. Building teen's safety confidence and competence in this way reduces their vulnerability to victimization, and increases their personal safety.
